Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the session:

All pupils will know there are many different types of habitats (e.g. rainforest, desert, etc.)

- Most pupils will understand that different animals have features to help them live in a specific habitat
- Some pupils will be able to deduce where an animal might live based on its features

Session Outline:

The story starts with a fennec fox who can not remember its way home. Through the story, the children learn about six different types of places (habitats) where the fennec fox travelled: woodland forests, taiga forests, rainforests, savannahs, water, and deserts. Each place is explored through sounds and videos as the fennec fox compares itself against animals that live in that place. Hands-on exploration of real biofacts (furs, etc.) reinforces the features that the animals in each place have (e.g. long fur, webbed feet, etc.). The story concludes with the pupils guessing which of the places is the fennec fox's home.
